- 1. In the basic letter the Commandant, U. S. Coast Guard, requested that a categorial determination be made as regards the eligibility of personnel of the U.S.S. SERPERS for the award of the Purple Heart Medal. The U.S.S. SERPERS, a Coast Guard manned Navy ammunition ship, exploded off Guadalcanal on 29 January 1945 and of all personnel aboard at the time of the explosion, only two survived.
- 2. Executive Order No. 9277 of December 3, 1942, provides, in part, as follows:
 - "(1) The Secretary of the Navy is authorised and directed to award the Purple Heart in the name of the President of the United States to persons who, while heretofore or here-after serving in any capacity with the Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard of the United States, are wounded in action against an enemy of the United States, or as a result of an act of such enemy, provided such wound necessitates treatment by a medical officer."
 - 1(3) The Secretary of the Navy is further authorised and directed to award the Purple Heart posthemously, in the name of the President of the United States, to any persons who, while serving in any capacity with the Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast (Mard of the United States, since December 6, 1941, are killed in action or who die as a direct result of wounds received in action with an enemy of the United States, or as a result of an act of such enemy...."

3. A careful study of the Naval Court of Inquiry into the loss of the SERPENS, and the endorsements thereto (particularly that by the Chief of the Bureau of Ordnance), indicates that the explosion was probably not caused by enemy action. This opinion is further substantiated by information received from the Commander Naval Forces, Far East, Enclosure (A) to this endorsement, which indicates that no operational movement was carried out by any of the Japanese Naval Operational Units in the vicinity of Guadal—canal on 29 January 1915.

h. In view of the foregoing and after careful study, the Board is of the opinion that the loss of the SERPENS and her crew was not in action with the enemy nor as a result of enemy action. The Board, therefore is constrained to recommend that subject personnel be found not eligible for the award of the Purple Heart.
